The meeting opened with the Lord's Prayer. The minutes from the September 14, 2020 meeting were read and approved.

Greg Gonyer discussed the movie night showing The Goonies that will take place at the Webster School property on October 10 at 7:30 P.M. Greg Gonyer talked about some of the improvements he would like to make to the concession stand including new paint inside the stand and additional stone for the batting cages. Greg Gonyer also reported on the progress of the car and tractor show scheduled for October 24 and mentioned many people are interested in participating if the weather is decent.

Mark Bushman discussed the quote from Worch Lumber for the storage building and the additional expense of the options that were not originally included. Jim Cajka relayed a quote from Northwood Door for overhead doors. Julie Foos confirmed with Joyce Nowak that this particular building will not need to be put out for bid. Mark Bushman moved to accept Resolution 20-013, A Resolution Authorizing Webster Township, Wood County, Ohio to Construct a Building for Storing Road Equipment. Jim Cajka seconded the motion, and all were in favor in a roll call vote. The Trustees will continue to figure out the details of what they want, and Jim Cajka will check with one more company.

Julie Foos explained the process for creating a fund to contain any grant revenue or donations for the recreational aspects of the Webster School property. Isaac Bailey moved to accept Resolution 20-014, A Resolution Requesting Approval From the Auditor of State to Establish a Special Revenue Fund for Webster Township, Wood County, Ohio. Mark Bushman seconded the motion and all were in favor in a roll call vote. Julie Foos asked the Trustees if they would like to officially dedicate the property as a park. The Trustees agreed not to move forward until there is a clear benefit to doing so.

Discussion turned to roads. Mark Bushman confirmed the County will fix the corner of Silverwood Road and State Route 105 and remove the catch basin on Silverwood Road yet this year. The County is still unsure if they will get to tar and chipping Silverwood Road. Isaac Bailey will continue to compile the documentation he gathered last year regarding the State Route 582 project, and he asked the County to help. The township needs to provide ODOT with evidence in hopes ODOT will reimburse for berming expenses.

Mark Bushman was contacted by Corey Speweik regarding boring Luckey Road so the new houses can tap into Luckey's sewer system. The Trustees agreed boring would not be necessary since the sewer line is on the west side of the road. Jim Cajka discussed the zoning issues with those lots.

Isaac Bailey will start spraying the roadsides in the next week.

There was nothing to report on the abandoned houses in the township, the drainage issues, or the replacement on the Zoning Commission.

Julie Foos is still trying to find someone to make stencils for the cemetery, and discussed the Historical Cemetery Walk scheduled for October 3. Bill Subsara is interested in putting another geocache somewhere in the cemetery. Mark Bushman asked about putting the portable restroom on the foundation for the old outhouse. Garry Evers suggested building something around the portable restroom so it isn't as noticeable.

Garry Evers asked if the township could berm the area between the road and inside the bridge walls on Main Road. Randy Aspacher will look at it. Randy Aspacher relayed the problems he has been having with the truck.

Mark Bushman moved to accept Resolution 20-015, A Resolution Accepting the Amounts and Rates as Determined by the Budget Commission and Authorizing the Necessary Tax Levies and Certifying Them to the County Auditor. Jim Cajka seconded the motion and all were in favor in a roll call vote.

The Trustees approved Middleton Township's fire and EMS contract for 2020 and 2021 through 2023.

The Trustees approved some Facebook posts including a post about the Knox Homebox that Troy and Freedom Townships are offering at cost for residents in their coverage areas.

Isaac Bailey will get some quotes for a flagpole for the Webster School property, and the Trustees discussed the preferred height.




